Company profits at record high  
**105 billion £**

BUT investments decreased by  
**- 1.5%** in 2016

Impact of 15% depreciation in the exchange rate  
Exports grew by **+ 1.6 pp** in a year

**FIRST SIGNS OF BREXIT during the exit negotiations phase**



**WEAK INTERNAL DEMAND**

Inflation up by **+2.7%**  
**3.3%** of disposing income  
> Due to the exchange rate shock  
> Savings at historically low rate

> Exchange rate shock

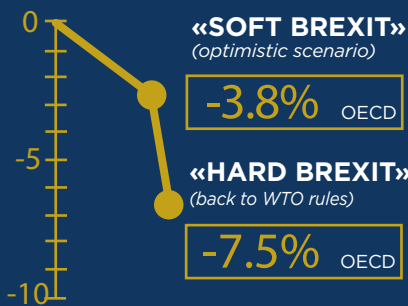


**INVESTMENTS REACHING THEIR LOWEST LEVELS SINCE THE CRISIS**

**TRADE PROTECTIONIST SHOCK TO GDP**



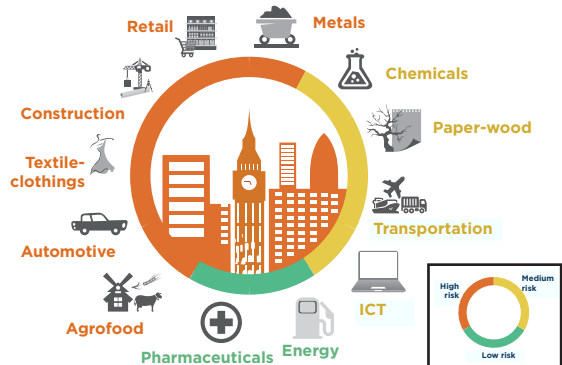
**WEAKENED ATTRACTION**
